The Family and Consumer Sciences option leads to the degree of Bachelor of Arts in Human Development. The program meets the requirements for both the Residential Teacher Certificate (4-12 grades) and the Career and Technical Education (CTE) Family and Consumer Sciences Certificate. Admission to the College of Education is necessary to complete the teacher preparation portion of the program.

Students must complete two state mandated tests for teacher candidates, and gather work experience verification as part of their certification requirements.

- WEST-B: a basic skills test covering reading, writing and mathematics. This is a self-paced test, approximately four hours in length. All three sections of this test must be completed prior to admission to the College of Education. Information about testing dates, locations and costs may be found at <http://www.west.nesinc.com>. A study guide is also available at this site.
- WEST-E: a content examination required for teacher certification and to verify “highly qualified” teacher status as required by the No Child Left Behind Act. This test must be passed prior to the beginning of student teaching. It is a self-paced test, approximately five hours in length. Information about testing dates, locations and costs may be found at <http://www.west.nesinc.com>. Study materials are also available at this site.
- 2,000 hours of paid work experience must be verified for CTE certification. Any paid work experience, except babysitting, may be used for Family and Consumer Sciences. Secure letters from previous employers or provide pay records indicating dates of employment and total hours of employment at each position for up to six years prior to application for certification. Submit this verification with the Initial CTE certificate application to Deborah J. Handy for review and approval.

Students completing this program most often seek teaching positions in public and/or private school settings, but also pursue careers in Extension, community service organizations, Better Business Bureaus, agricultural commissions (egg, beef, lentil, fryer), or a variety of other business settings.
